Special Interest Groups

Special Interest Groups (SIGs) provide unique opportunities for professional development within ASTDBR. Members can participate in SIGs as a SIG leader or SIG member.

As a SIG Leader you have an opportunity to share your passion while leading and engaging peers without the same time commitment as serving on the board of directors. ASTDBR currently has four active SIGs: Books and Literature, eLearning, Students, and CPLP Study Group. Leadership of ASTDBR SIGs change on annual basis. As a SIG Member you have an informal, flexible venue to share knowledge and meet with peers who have an interest in similar topics outside of our monthly meeting. These small groups meet on a regular basis. They are a great way to learn from one another's experiences, share best practices, and keep up to date on the latest trends in your field of interest.

Attendance for any particular SIG usually ranges from 2 to 12 people. Formats vary depending on the focus of the SIG. Participation in the SIGs are an added benefit of your membership in ASTDBR. The Books and Literature SIG is an open forum for members to share and discuss literature and research on a range of topics. Participants can recommend books, articles, and web sites for discussion and review in the group.

eLearning

The Student SIG is in place to engage and support students within the SHREWD program at LSU and other HRD programs in the Baton Rouge area. Topics for discussion are flexible in this group because the needs of our student membership is ever changing.

CPLP Study Group

CPLP Study Group SIG seeks to encourage membership to further their professional development through the obtainment of the Certified Professional in Learning and Performance (CPLP) certification and coach certification applicants through all steps of the CPLP process, including the CPLP exam and work example submissions.
